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Enhancing Resilience through Teacher Education Project ENRETE

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




A two-year project funded by Erasmus+ (2016-2018)

Overall aim: the creation of learning environments which promote the resilience and growth of marginalised learners by providing them with the tools, resources and learning contexts which facilitate their academic and social and emotional learning and consequently their social inclusion and active citizenship.

Objectives

- The aim of the project is to develop a set of modules for teacher education in student resilience which will constitute a European Masters in Resilience
 - modules seek to develop educators' competence in responding to, and addressing, the academic, social and emotional needs of learners at risk in their development and education, including learners from ethnic, linguistic, and migrant communities, from socio-economic disadvantage and learners with learning difficulties and individual educational needs.



Programme of activities

Year 1: in the first year, the partners will develop 10 modules which will be internally and externally evaluated.


Year 2: in the second year, the modules will be piloted with 20 teachers in each of the six partner countries, following which the they will be evaluated and reviewed. The modules are also externally evaluated

The modules will be developed as both face to face and online modules.

Module 9 Research methods in resilience education (10 ECTS)

- Quantitative research methods: data collection and analysis, use of instrument
- Qualitative research methods: data collection and analysis, use of instruments





Dissertation (30 ECTS)

- 15,000-20,000 words or submission of a paper to a peer reviewed journal
- Practice based research, includes data collection

Piloting

- Following internal and external review, each partner will pilot a theme from study unit 1 (Introduction) and another study unit (20 hours in total) with about 10-15 practising teachers.
- Evaluation of training through quantitative and qualitative data
- Final review of study units and finalisation of face to face and online modules
- Preparation for the launch of the European Masters
